## **Borough Councillors support roof!**

We are pleased to note that our borough councillors John Izett and Sam Carr have both agreed to provide £1500 from their personal councillor grant funds towards the repair costs of the failing changing room roof at the Ecchinswell Village Hall complex.

## Government legislation will help support our Neighbourhood Plan

Current legislation going through Parliament, the Levelling Up and Regeneration Bill, should extend the protection provided by our Neighbourhood Plan against aggressive housing estate development. Presently we have two years protection, but if the legislation gets through, this will be extended to 5 years. Fingers crossed. At that point we will need to update our Plan to reflect local needs. This is important as rules requiring a favourable approach to 'sustainable' development continue to be in play because the Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is apparently some way off meeting its housing targets, as well as its Local Plan still being someway off completion.

#### Keep an eye out for electric scooters.

Riders of electric scooters have been seen locally on our roads and on footpaths. These are illegal actions and should be reported to the Police if you see this happening.

## Our Speed Indicator Device moves around!

Hopefully all of you car drivers will have noted the SID is turning up at different locations across our parish roads. This is intended to help us recognise the speed limit along all parts of our rural roads. The data obtained will be compiled to put together a picture of the volume of traffic and its speed across the parish. Please look out for any suspicious activity around the device as there have been a number of attempts to tamper with it.
