The Parish Council meeting took place at the Ecchinswell Village Hall on the 10th October. There were no members of the public present.

Our County Councillor, Derek Mellor, reported that although the cost of providing adult social care is 1.3 million pounds a day HCC are keeping within budget and in the main keeping the elderly in their own homes for as long as possible. He also had positive news regarding education. Hampshire schools have come out on average four per cent above the national average in the recent SATS tests. Road maintenance is still well on schedule with one million square metres of potholes successfully repaired. As you may have noticed the Ecchinswell to Bishops Green road is marked up ready for attention.

Parishes along the route of the A339 are expressing concern regarding increased pressure on this road once the new housing developments in Basingstoke, Newbury and Thatcham are completed. A working party has been formed to provide improved access from the feeder roads between Basingstoke and Newbury. The Manydown project in Basingstoke will not be completed until 2021 so this is a long term project. We will provide updates on the progress that is being made

By the time this report reaches you all the annual pond clearance will have taken place. Many thanks to all who have helped make the day a success. Particularly the Basingstoke Volunteer Group without whose help the work could not be undertaken.
