The tree surgeon is due to start work on 18th December. This is the initial review, and any urgent works will then be carried out. Great news that we can hopefully alleviate any worries about unsafe trees on parish council land.

The owners are coming up with fresh ideas to manage the area and for your information there are several allotments available for rent.
