The annual **Pond Clearance** will take place on **Sunday the 2nd November** starting at 09:30. Support from the Basingstoke Conservation Volunteers, will help us remove some areas of the pink flowering rush (Butomus Umbellatus) which has had prolific growth this year, but we still need all the enthusiastic help we can muster. Our aim, as always is to maintain this community facility and preserve the pond as a natural habitat for plant and animal life.

If there are any keen fly fishers among you, who could donate a pair of chest waders for the day that would be wonderful (preferably with your own legs inside)! Hot soup & freshly barbecued hotdogs from Long Court Farm will be available for volunteers and helpers, so please come along and join in this communal event.

The response to **Community Speedwatch** initiative has been disappointing as the Council has put much time and effort into this ongoing problem & considering there is so much concern over vehicles travelling at injudicious speed through the village. However this is an effective method of controlling excess speed with the support of our local police. Full details are on our website. As you are probably aware a large majority of speeding offenders are locals, so please make sure one of them is not YOU.

Potholes and Highways. The situation re potholes has improved slightly over the summer period thanks to the good weather and the relatively quick responses from Hampshire County Council, although we are still rattling their cages over sunken trenches near the school and the road by the Ecchinswell church. The Parish Council is supporting Ecchinswell Village Hall to acquire funds from the Local Infrastructure Levy (money from developments) to enable the renewal and improvements to the play park at the hall.
