Our March meeting took place on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> at Ecchinswell Village Hall.

We have had a vacancy for a parish councillor for many months now and we're delighted to welcome Stephen Bate to the team as a new councillor. Stephen has returned to the parish after working abroad for a period of time and now lives in the Palmers Yard area. He joins Marian Dain, Jackie Bayliss, Nick Owen, Samantha Keyse, Lissa Lowrie and me on the council – all supported by our clerk, Doreen Gascoine. It's good to have a full complement.

Whilst most of the parish either has, or is expecting to get superfast broadband, there are always a few outlying properties who may not receive it. The Dept of Culture, Media and Sport has made a commitment to provide every home and business in the UK with access to a basic broadband service. If you cannot access an affordable broadband service with a speed of at least 2 Mb per second, you may be eligible for a subsidised installation with subsidies of up to £350. They're sited at the top of Oakfields Close opposite the Royal Oak pub and we have three vacant plots. They're all ready for planting and the rental is £30 per annum for a large plot or £20 for a smaller one.
