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7. Securities

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Notes

- (i) Upon election or co-option, a Member must register their pecuniary and other registerable interests (including that of their spouse or partner) with the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days of their election/co-option.
- (ii) 'Relevant authority' refers to the body to which you have become an elected, coopted or appointed member.
- (iii) Please check your entries in the register regularly to ensure they are up to date. It is your responsibility to report any change in circumstance and to make sure that details reported to the Monitoring Officer are up to date and correct,
- (iv) It will be a breach of the Council's Code of Conduct to omit information, provide information that is materially false or fail to keep the information up to date.
